NOTE: Some varieties of chilies vary a great deal in heat levels. There are no guarantees. Mother Nature plays a big role on heat levels. Dry years seem to be hotter than wet years. But Mother Nature is sure to let you know "there are no rules" when you think you have it figured out.

Tigges Farm "SAHUARO" has been the most consistent chile as to heat level.

Greely Chubby is not officially ranked on the Scoville Scale - it is the Tigges Farm "best guess taste-test."

Not all varieties are available throughout the season. This chart will help you select a chile within the same heat range if the one you wanted is not available. We pick every day, so "ask" if you don't find the chile you want. It might be on its way in - or it might be needing more time to grow and won't be in for a while.
